

There are a lot of resources for children online with disabilities, there are a lot of resources for older adults and hospice groups. Um, there are a lot of resources for psychiatric settings and substance abuse. But as far as specific intervention ideas for adults with IDD, I couldn't find any.

[00:01:25] There were a lot of children. And you can't sing Twinkle Twinkle Little Star to an adult appropriately. Usually. I don't like to make, uh, general sweeping statements, uh, because every now and then, maybe it could be for an individual, but in general, adults need music that fits their age, that respects their age and respects that they're adults, who still need support.

[00:01:52] A lot of individuals with disabilities lose a lot of support after grade school and early intervention where they have a [00:02:00] lot of support and parapros and prompting and schedules and they kind of graduate and it's like, what's next? Fortunately, there are a lot of day programs and organizations providing these supports, but there's still advocacy needed for these adults with disabilities so that they can get the same opportunities as everybody else.

[00:02:20] And as a music therapist, I feel really strongly about that because I want there to be music opportunities for all. Uh, for children with disabilities, for adults with disabilities. Um, if an adult wants to make music, they have the right to. And sometimes need that extra support to make the music and to participate in music.

[00:02:42] And as a music therapist, I want to figure out how to help them as much as possible make music. So, on that note, I started talking to some other people, too, and, um, just in general, this is, um, an underserved population as far as online [00:03:00] resources. So I want this podcast to serve as a space to provide online resources for professionals that work with individuals with



disabilities so that we can be providing the highest quality of services for these individuals who deserve it.

[00:03:16] So, the podcast will feature several guests who work with disabilities, um, work with adults who have disabilities, I should say. And um, and that's their main gig, and um, I definitely don't want to limit this to music therapy. Uh, I will talk about music therapy a lot, because that is my perspective, but I definitely want to interview all sorts of professionals who work with these amazing adults and individuals.
